# Sheridan Blau, Ph.D.

**Professor of Education and English,  
University of California, Santa Barbara**

Dr. Sheridan Blau, who began his teaching career as an inner city high school English teacher, directs the South Coast Writing Project and the Literature Institute for Teachers at the University of California, Santa Barbara. He has held senior advisory roles on the teaching of English for the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, the College Board, and the American Board for Teacher Education. Dr. Blau served for 20 years as a member of the National Writing Project Advisory Board and Task Force, and he is a former President of the National Council of Teachers of English. He has been awarded by his campus and by national professional associations for his teaching, research, and contributions to the profession of English.

Dr. Blau has published widely in the areas of seventeenth century literature, composition theory, professional development for teachers, and the teaching of composition and literature. He has also written and edited textbooks in composition and literature for students in middle school, high school, and college classrooms. His most notable book for teachers and scholars, *The Literature Workshop: Teaching Texts and Their Readers* (2003), was named by the Conference on English Education as the winner of the 2004 Richard Meade Award for outstanding research in English education.
