Dr. Donald Leu is the Neag Endowed Chair in Literacy and Technology at the University of Connecticut and holds a joint appointment in Curriculum and Instruction and Educational Psychology. He directs the New Literacies Research Lab and is a member of the Board of Directors of the International Reading Association and the Reading Hall of Fame. He is a past President of the National Reading Conference and is an editor of the *Handbook of Research on New Literacies*.

A graduate of Michigan State, Harvard, and Berkeley, Dr. Leu studies the new skills required to read, write, and learn with Internet technologies and the best instructional practices that prepare students for these new literacies. He has contributed to more than 100 research publications and 17 books on topics that include comprehension, teacher education, vocabulary, and the new literacies of online reading comprehension. He has given keynote addresses in Europe, Australia, Asia, South America, and North America. His research has been funded by the U.S. Department of Education, the National Science Foundation, the Department of Defense, the North Central Educational Research Lab, the Carnegie Corporation, the Institute for Education Sciences, the Annenberg Foundation, the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and the Australian Council of Educational Research.
